"The day is aimed at amenity tree managers, arboricultural consultants, urban foresters, practising arborists and tree surgeons. Contrary to the general perception, there is significant overlap between tree management of woodlands and the sub-urban and urban environments. Gone are the days when the division was the 'forest gate'; this is particularly relevant when we consider the various strains of *Phytophthora sp.* that have the potential to affect all our nation's tree populations and have no regard for man-made landscape divisions. Tree roots are affected by our actions throughout the landscape, the careful control and mitigation of those activities is something often overlooked; the second half of the day will discuss approaches to minimise and mitigate root damage."
